PRECAUTIONS

Warning: Acid has strong corrosive properties. If batteries are handled inappropriately, there is a risk that personal injury may result from exposure to harmful electrolyte influences. Therefore, suitable remedies for acid damage must be kept readily available. Soapy water would be a suitable remedy.

Warning: If electrolyte drips out from the battery, skin can be burned by acid, and the vehicle may be affected by acid erosion and corrosion. It is a possibility that safety-related vehicle components can be damaged.

Warning: The gas resulting from charging and partially after charging is explosive. In extreme cases, if the battery is handled inappropriately, the emitted gases may cause the battery to explode.

Warning: Producing sparks by sanding, welding, cutting and open flames, as well as smoking near a battery is forbidden. Producing sparks through electrostatic discharge must also be avoided. Always touch the vehicle body before touching the battery.

Warning: Only perform battery procedures in suitable and well-ventilated locations.

Always ensure vehicle electrical system is protected by disconnecting battery ground terminal prior to servicing key areas of the electrical system. Disconnecting battery positive terminal must only be performed as required to remove battery from vehicle and must only be carried out after ground terminal is disconnected.

The battery is installed in the lefthand side of the luggage compartment.

BATTERY

Removal

1. Record radio anti-theft code and station presets.
2. Turn off all lamps and accessories.
3. Turn ignition switch to OFF position.




Fig. 1 Service cover removal

4. Remove luggage compartment service cover (1) from side trim panel (2) in direction of arrow, **Fig. 1**.




Fig. 2 Battery cable removal




Fig. 3 Central venting hose removal

5. Loosen and remove battery ground cable (1) from battery ground terminal, **Fig. 2**.
6. Open pole cover (arrow) over battery positive cable, **Fig. 2**.
7. Loosen and remove battery positive cable (2) from battery positive terminal, **Fig. 2**.
8. Remove central venting hose (1) from battery connection, **Fig. 3**.




Fig. 4 Battery hold down removal

9. Remove battery mounting bolt (1), **Fig. 4**.
10. Remove battery hold down (2), **Fig. 4**.




Fig. 5 Battery removal

11. Fold up handles (arrows) and remove battery, **Fig. 5**.

Installation

1. Install battery and ensure it is fully seated.
2. Install battery hold down (2), **Fig. 4**.
3. Install battery mounting bolt (1), and **torque** to 25 ft. lbs., **Fig. 4**.
4. Install battery positive cable (2) to battery positive terminal, and **torque** to 53 inch lbs., **Fig. 2**.
5. Install battery ground cable (1) to battery ground terminal, and **torque** to 53 inch lbs., **Fig. 2**.




Fig. 6 Central gas venting hose installation

6. Install central gas venting hose, ensuring that central gas venting hose (1) is inserted into rubber grommet (2) and is not kinked after installation, **Fig. 6**.
7. Install luggage compartment service cover (1) to side trim panel (2), **Fig. 1**.
8. Reset all preset and theft codes previously recorded to radio.
9. Inspect any affected system or component such as clock, comfort adjustment, or compass for proper settings, and adjust as required.
